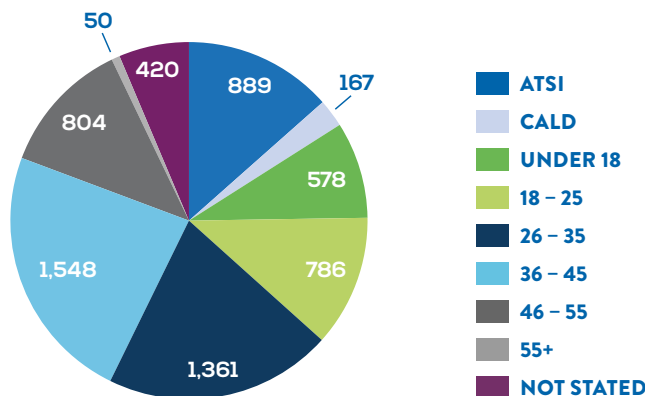

Over the past 12 months Youth, Family and Community Connections Inc. (YFCC) has worked hard to ensure our solutions and practices continue to be people led, people focussed and holistic, taking into consideration all biopsychosocial determinants. We provide a range of treatment services, including case management, counselling, brief intervention, education and referral. We have a "no wrong door" approach - working to collocate offices, coordinate practices, share responsibilities and improve communication among caseworkers.

We have extended our place-based and outreach services this year, with the commencement of the Community Alcohol and Drug Support Service. This Service, delivered in partnership with the Circular Head Aboriginal Corporation, is supported by Primary Health Tasmania under the Australian Government's Primary Health Networks Program. The Service provides alcohol and drug support focussed on early intervention, treatment and prevention relapse and is based in Smithton, Wynyard and King Island. It provides opportunities to strengthen our partnerships in these regions, ensuring people who are experiencing negative effects from the use of alcohol and other drugs have access to appropriate and timely supports.

Our continuous quality improvement framework combined with our outcomes star model of practice assist us in delivering relevant, meaningful and change-making services in the North West and West Coasts of Tasmania.
